Dear parent or guardian,

To help young people who live or attend a school in Greater Manchester, Transport for Greater Manchester (TfGM) has a proof-of-age card that allows young people to pay the 'child fare' when travelling on public transport.

The igo pass is a photo ID which all bus, Metrolink, and rail staff recognise as proof that passengers are under the age of 16 and therefore entitled to pay the 'child fare'.

If your child is 16 or under and uses public transport, then they will need an igo card. The igo card is valid until the 31 August after your child's 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

From 1 June 2017, the cost of a new and replacement igo card will be £10 to allow TfGM to recover the costs for administering the scheme. The igo card saves your child money every time they travel, as without it, they must pay the adult fare.

Getting an igo is easy. Application forms can be downloaded from our website at [www.tfgm.com/igo](http://www.tfgm.com/igo) or collected from one of our Travelshops located across Greater Manchester.
