Catholic Life of the School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Mrs Gerschler and the RE team have been extremely busy this Easter season and the key message has been one of **hope**.



- ✓ At the start of the Month our Yr7 GIFT team crowned Mary during a special liturgy in the Chapel. Students read prayers, recited the Rosary and adorned our statue of Mary with flowers. On receiving the sad news about Mrs Jones, they used the time to reflect and write our own prayers for her.
- ✓ Yr7 have been preparing a special liturgy to celebrate Pentecost. Each Yr7
 form will have time to reflect on the importance of this time of year for
 the Church but also our own personal experience of the Holy Spirit active
 in the world today.
- To celebrate the Ascension, a Holy Day of Obligation, each form had opportunity to reflect on the Ascension of Jesus and what it 'The Great Commission' is reflected in 'The St Damian's Way' especially 'Service'. Our local parish invited students to join them at 7pm Mass to celebrate this special feast day.
- ✓ Yr8 and Yr9 GIFT teams have been supporting the community through their loss by writing prayers in meetings, students have used collective mindful activities such as meditation and guided Gospel readings. Stewardship has also been part of the meetings, looking at our own environment and ways we can support the wider community to live out the messages of Laudato Si.
- Our Yr10 GIFT team, along with Calvin's friends, helped to plan and prepare a memorial service for him. Deeply affected by his untimely death, they shared who he was and celebrated his life with the Year group. Calvin's family were invited and spoke about him to Yr10 alongside his close friends who wrote personal reflections on what a fantastic friend he was. As part of our tribute, Yr10 wrote memories and prayers and hung these the bereavement tree. Our service started with prayers and we released balloons at the Bereavement Garden. These were a symbolic gesture of those gathered releasing prayers and memories into God's hands. Our Yr10 were reverent and respectful, with students gathering in silence and praying together. Calvin will not be forgotten, and we pray for God's love and protection for Calvin and the people who grieve for him.



✓ The Yr10 GIFT team also focused their meetings on 'The Words of Pope Francis' based upon the recently released 'Stories of a Generation – With Pope Francis'. This was a chance to reflect on the teaching of the Pope through social media and how relevant they are for today.

Safeguarding Update

This half term, staff have had CPD on how to *identify and challenge sexual harassment* amongst young people. This is a growing concern because of the increased use of unacceptable sexualised language amongst children. Sexual harassment covers a wide range of issues from unkind words to unwanted physical touching. Due to the severity of this Mrs Brophy has reinforced the importance of our students reporting interactions with sexualised content in assemblies. We believe that it is only through education and an open culture of reporting that we can promote respect and moral judgement in our students. As a parent myself it is important to have the mind-set that this *'could happen to my child'*. In essence, no child is immune to being an unwanted victim of sexual harassment.

Inappropriate use of Social Media



It has come to my attention that a number of our students are misusing social media. Most of this misuse is taking place outside school hours but I still have the authority to sanction students even if this is the case. Can I ask parents/carers that you regularly check what your child is being exposed to online. Whilst we continue to educate our students about what is appropriate/inappropriate content in whole school assemblies and PSHE lessons, parents must also bear some responsibility. In a recent Yr8 assembly, the Head of Year's motto regarding social media was 'if it's not kind, don't share it'. This should be the motto share at home. Furthermore, please do not believe that 'this isn't about my child' as it equally applies to all children.

Operation Spectre – Knife Crime Presentation

St Damian's were delighted to welcome Prison Officer Paul McGovern MBE, from HMP Manchester, who works within the Prison Community Team which engages with children in local schools to break the cycle of children being peer pressured into local crime gangs.

Our School engagement officers Greg and Tony and neighbourhood PCSOs joined Paul to help deliver an

Operation Sceptre 'Actions have Consequences' workshops to our Yr7 to Yr10. Operation Sceptre was a focus on knife crime session,



all done in a fun, but very informative way. The session is vital to preventing knife crime and focusing on young people to help aid their education around the consequences of carrying a knife. The team were also joined by Lauren from the Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue service who spoke to our pupils about the importance of



keeping safe around water during the Summer.

Department for Education [DfE] Update

- Visit: Last half term a film crew, working on behalf of the DfE, visited St Damian's [one of only five schools chosen from across England] to build a library of footage and create video content for their social media and event presentations, in order to improve the quality of DfE communications and better illustrate the work they do in purchasing/procurement of school equipment. The crew were extremely complementary of how polite, well behaved and well 'turned out' our students were. Furthermore, they were impressed with the school in general. It is always great to hear positive feedback from external visitors.
- Improving our safety: We have recently received 2 new defibrillators from the DfE. These will ensure that everyone in our school community [as well as outside our school] has the reassurance














 that such essential lifesaving equipment is on our school site. They will also build on the delivery of our curriculum, with students having the opportunity to be trained in life-saving first aid methods, and the essential need and purpose of defibrillators in CPR.

St Andrews University

On the 5th of May, Yr7 students took part in an enriching webinar organised in collaboration with the University of St. Andrews. Dina Nayeri, who ran the session, is an Iranian-America novelist, essayist, and short story writer. She spoke to the children about her own experience as a refugee, about how displacement affects us all, and about the power of welcome. After the session, students were invited to consider if their impression of 'what a refugee looks like' had changed. All students were also given a free copy of Dina's book, *The Waiting Place*. The university will use the responses and ideas to further their own research in this area.

Mathematics Update

- United Kingdom Mathematics Trust [UKMT]. St Damian's entered the UKMT [Intermediate Mathematical challenge] back in February and following great results we entered a further 35 Yr7 and 62 Yr8 students for the Junior Mathematical Challenge. Well, a fantastic 58% of our entrants achieved an award! The challenge involved a 1 hour assessment where students needed to answer 25 questions requiring high level analytical skills. The challenge is taken by high ability students from across the UK and British schools overseas. Nationally, only 8%, 16% and 25% of entrants achieve Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards, respectively. We are incredibly proud of all who have taken part and are delighted to announce that 56 students achieved awards, 1 Gold, 24 Silver and 31 Bronze Awards. As the extra-curricular offering grows in Mathematics, we look forward to more success next year. Well done to all the winners and all the students who took part! Can I also thank Mr Willerton for facilitating this excellent opportunity to stretch our more able children in Maths.
- National Numeracy Day: Wednesday 17th May 2023 was National Numeracy Day. Numeracy skills are essential to have, and St Damian's





Challenge in computer rooms which helps to build their confidence with numbers and practise their skills. Finally, students took part in a 'treasure hunt' during lunch. Problems were carefully chosen in each subject to show students the importance of numeracy across the
