Catholic Life of the School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another packed programme of events this half term from Mrs Gerschler and her RE team! So many external guests visited the school community to share their expertise and enhance our catholic life provision.

• Yr11 GCSE RE revision: During the last half term holiday, Rabbi Chaim Cohen worked with Yr11 students, preparing them for the Judaism GCSE unit. We are proud to work alongside our Jewish partners to build strong interfaith relationships and hear first-hand from that faith tradition directly. Students learnt about the Messiah, traditional marriage rituals and worship in the Synagogue. Rabbi Cohen also brought in some items used in worship that the pupils could look at up close. Rabbi Cohen said "Thanks for the warm welcome at your school today. Both classes were a real pleasure to speak to, and I was most impressed both by their knowledge as well as their level of engagement! They are a true credit to you and your department!". This was lovely to hear. Well done to the Yr11 students!



• Caritas Ambassadors: This group of students enjoyed fantastic training delivered from Caritas Salford. We would like to thank Kathryn Ansley, Formation coordinator for Caritas, for her inspirational advice that will take this group from strength to strength. Our aim is to put our faith into action and take the message of hope and love to all we meet.

• Yr7 GIFT team: This month it was great to see the Yr7 GIFT team receive their Purple ties and receive

some training on Mass preparation from our link governor, Sister Roseline. This leadership group is very eager and have many ideas on developing Faith Formation at St Damian's. The GIFT team will also work



closely on 'Hope in the future'. We are excited to see the team spread the message of Jesus in the hearts and minds of all.













- Reconciliation: Yr7-10 attended a Reconciliation service led by Fr Philip Sumner. It was great to see
 'The St Damian's Way' in practice, working together collaboratively to make a special moment for
 the students we serve. Fr Sumner received a warm welcome and there were many compliments
 about how he delivered the importance of forgiveness. All years respected the reverence of the
 service. A special thanks to Mr McArdle for the wonderful music and fantastic singing from the
 Choir and individual singers. I would also like to commend the Yr8 GIFT team for their eloquent
 reading.
- St Joseph's Parishioners: Our Hope in the future link this month was with our local parish community from St Joseph's, who joined us for 'fish and chip' Friday lunch. They were hosted by the Yr7 GIFT team who delivered a reflection on faith during the Lent season. Our guests were entertained by the Caritas Ambassadors with a game of Bingo and a quiz. It is great to see our students leading from the front and building their confidence.
- Prayer: This half term, the Yr8 GIFT Team have been focusing on mindful prayer, making mindful prayer 'handprints'. They also helped with the Reconciliation Service. They are currently working on an Easter Display for our Chapel to celebrate that He has risen! Alleluia! Our Yr9 GIFT team have focused on creative prayer, writing different prayers that are focused on stewardship and caring for our common home, the planet, as well as each other. They have taken time to deliver a prayer that they have written each morning to different forms across the school, keeping the pastoral theme at the forefront of our thoughts each day. The Yr9 GIFT team have also made colourful 'prayer chains', where they have written down the names of people that they would like our community to pray for, such as those impacted by the war in Ukraine or the Earthquake in Turkey.
- Yr10 GIFT team: These leaders have independently created activities for form groups during Lent. Using key quotations from the Lent and Easter seasons Namitwil Chandra has created a 'Word of God Treasure hunt' around school giving students a chance to win an Easter egg. As a focus for prayer during Lent Akshaya Babiyansebastin has created a 'Daily Lent Prayer Timetable' for forms to use. Ben Sharples has created a Chapel activity writing task, 'My Lent promise' which will be used to create a chapel display. Finally, Amy Holmes and Myriam Mambu have created and shared a "Holy week what is it?" information PPT for students and staff. Well done to everyone!

Safeguarding Update

During this half term staff were trained by Chris Henniker from CGL [Change, Grow, Live] about Child Criminal Exploitation [CCE]. Chris showed a presentation on the vulnerabilities of young people in our society and how they can innocently be drawn into gang culture. As a school we felt that our young people should have this information shared with them and in the final couple of weeks in school Mrs Brophy led assemblies focusing on 'chicken shop grooming'. This 5 minute video led to thought provoking conversations and opened up discussions on how easily the generosity of a stranger can have serious outcomes. I ask that you take the time to watch this 5 minute video which shows how seemingly innocent interactions can lead to your child becoming thousands of pounds in debt and manipulated and coerced by exploiters. Yr11 Update

The vast majority of Yr11 students are working really hard in school. I ask that parents ensure that they are working hard at home too. This is what they have to do to fulfil their potential. I repeat that there is no substitute for hard work but the rewards, great GCSE outcomes, are worth it!

Mentoring: After the MOCK exams in January, we introduced a mentoring programme for a number
of Yr11 students to raise their achievement and confidence. It is great to see most students engaging
with this mentoring and making progress. Please continue to support us by encouraging your child
to attend all revision sessions offered and to attend their mentoring sessions.











- Intervention. This continues before and after school. It builds confidence, ensures students get into good habits/routines as well as exam practice. I ask that parents ensure that they support this initiative. Your child will know what intervention to attend.
- Btec PE exam: Results will be released in April and I hope these may allow students the opportunity
 to improve their current grade. It is vital students continue to work hard in their final Leadership
 unit. They must read and understand the assessment criteria in order to add sufficient detail into
 their work. It is essential students meet deadlines given.
- English. Mrs Turbatu was delighted with the attendance of students at the additional English Language mock on the staff INSET day in March. The positive attitude of the children was really impressive and demonstrated their commitment to achieving their potential. Keep up the hard work Yr11- your English teachers are delighted with your efforts!
- *Prom.* A reminder to say that this is by invitation only. It is a great night to celebrate 5 years at St Damian's. Sadly, 2 students have had their invitations withdrawn.
- Days Left. There are now 18 school days left before the first exam which is Religious Studies on the 15th May. The exam timetable is on the school website under the General Information tab.
- Easter Revision: I am delighted to say that there is a comprehensive revision schedule in place for the Easter break. Your child will be asked to attend these. I ask that you support the school by ensuring your child attends.

Many of our Yr11 students are working extremely hard at the moment attending intervention classes before and after school and their ASPIRE assembly provided an important opportunity to recognise their efforts.

Careers Week

Week commencing the 6th March, saw all students in Yrs 7 -10 learn more about their future Careers options. Miss Joyce organised a wide variety of external speakers in school ranging from, 'Corpus Christi College, The University of Oxford' to a local employer 'Whitecroft Lighting Limited' discussing the apprenticeship opportunities that they provide.













Students also participated in a variety of Careers lessons from each subject, to learn about the opportunities specific subjects may lead to. One aim of our careers provision is to inspire students to think positively about their futures.

The St Damian's community have been raising money for Calvin in Yr 10 who in March 2022 was diagnosed with T-cell lymphoblast leukaemia. This is a very rare form of cancer and to date there is no known cure. We've held lots of fund-raising events, such as staff verses the Yr10 football team, where,

Today we were also delighted to welcome Calvin and his parents into Yr10 Assembly so that Calvin could say hello to his friends and thank them for all their support and how that support is keeping "his spirits high and fighting". Thank you, for your generous contributions and we ask that you continue to keep Calvin and his family in your thoughts and prayers.

Eco Club and Planting Trees

On Monday 6th March, the St Damian's Eco Club assisted in a project organised by the City of Trees, a local charity, which aims to plant a tree for every resident of Greater Manchester (3 million) to help tackle the climate emergency. Over the course of the day, our Eco Club, led by Mr Stoneley, helped to plant over 200 trees on the school field. Not only will this improve the drainage on the school fields, but it will help to reduce the amount of CO² in the atmosphere in the long-term. The students were not only excellent ambassadors for the school, but also for Laudato Si', by helping to care for our common home.

• English Independent Learning Projects: Over the past few weeks, the whole of Year Nine has been busy completing an independent learning project based on the social and historical context of the play 'Romeo and Juliet'. This is an essential part of their study of this GCSE literature text. The standard of work across all teaching groups has been outstanding. It has been an almost impossible task for teachers to choose the best projects, as their work has been so creative and beautifully presented. The winners in each class have been rewarded this week with Easter eggs in their Aspire assemblies. The English Faculty have been genuinely impressed and proud of their students. Great work Year Nine!

Yr10 Update

- Yr10 Sheffield Trip: On 23rd March, Yr10 students travelled to The University of Sheffield to engage in a Careers Exhibition. They engaged with a range of providers including Russell group universities, The Army, Aldi and numerous apprenticeship providers. Feedback from the students indicated that they are now more informed about the range of options open to them post-16. Miss Joyce stated that all students were exceptionally well behaved and a pleasure to take out for the day! This is great to hear and I hope that this will raise the aspirations of Yr10.
- Prefects: The application deadline for Prefects and Head Boy/ Head Girl has now passed. Over the next few weeks each candidate's application will be processed and the criteria applied. Students applying for Head Boy and Head girl will be shortlisted and a small number will be invited for interview. Every year, this is a challenging process as the calibre of students is exceptionally high. Therefore, selecting the successful candidates is difficult. We appreciate that some students may be disappointed, but we do value the contributions that all our students make towards school life.
- Btec results for Child Development and Construction: Well done to the Yr10 students who received their BTEC grades last Friday. The results, which count towards their final qualification, have shown that students who prepare well and work hard in class are rewarded with great outcomes! Congratulations and keep the momentum up!





 Upcoming Yr10 exams. These are due to start on 24th of April. These assessments will take place in the hall and will last for a fortnight. It is crucial that your child is working for at least 2 hours a night to ensure that they are prepared thoroughly. From experience, students who work hard in Yr10 have less pressure in Yr11. I ask that you ensure your child has a quiet place to study.

Yr7 Parents' Evening

The last parents' evening took place at the beginning of the month. It was the first 'formal' engagement that many parents had with staff. There was a great turnout [nearly 90%] and there was a real sense of purpose to the evening. The feedback from parents was overwhelmingly positive. 110 parents would recommend the school, no-one said they wouldn't recommend the school and one parent said they didn't know. One comment said "There's possibly an issue at lunch/break with limited access to the toilets? Full of children vaping. You may already be aware". I just want to reassure this parent and other parents that there are no issues with toilets at lunch time or incidents of large numbers of children vaping. However, where there have been a small number of vaping and/or bringing vapes to school appropriate sanctions have been given. For avoidance of doubt, vaping is not allowed at school.

World Book Day

Celebrations were afoot for World Book Day on the 2nd March. Firstly, students took part in a form time task, testing their knowledge on famous authors and book titles. Students had the chance to win a 'guess the teacher reading' competition and a treasure hunt task, linked to famous quotes from texts that students may have read in a series of different subjects. The highlight of the day was a 'Book Swap' event, where students brought in their old books from home and swapped with other students for a different text. Some students left the Literacy Hub with armfuls of new books to read. The librarian, Ms Toole and Mrs Heenan were delighted that so many of our students want to read for pleasure – it has the biggest positive impact of any factor on children's life chances. At St Damian's we will continue to instil a love of reading and its importance.

Pi Day

On the 14th March the Maths Department celebrated π Day, known as Pi. Pi is the symbol used in to represent a constant that is the ratio of the circumference of a circle to its diameter. This is approximately 3.14. In lessons, students used string to investigate the relationship between the diameter and the circumference of a circle. All KS3 students took part in a problem-solving competition with 5 questions increasing in difficulty. Maths staff wore Pi T-shirts to celebrate the day. A competition was held for students and staff to see who could remember the most digits. Congratulations to Shaun Shibu who increased his record to 225 digit and Miss Smith who was the staff winner, remembering 38 of them. Well done Shaun and Miss Smith!!

Duke of Edinburgh Award

On Thursday & Friday this week, 40 Yr10 students practiced their Duke of Edinburgh expedition and training. Students explored our local countryside around Dovestone including Chew reservoir, Alphin Pike and Swineshaw. Andy Ross, our approved activity provider and expedition leader, put students through their paces with real-life first aid scenarios, orienteering and map-reading and camp craft. Miss Price, Mr Healey and Ms Toole assisted the group and loved the challenges in doing so. Can I take this opportunity to thank these staff, in particular Miss Price who does a great job organising this scheme every year. The students learn so many important life skills.

PSHE Curriculum Update

A few week ago, Miss Bury, trained staff on the importance of PSHE in the curriculum, with a particular focus on 'protected characteristics' and 'fundamental British values'. As a community whose core value is respect, at St Damian's we do not tolerate **any form** of discrimination. The briefing also highlighted some recent changes to marriage law, with the age of marriage now at 18 with consent removed for 16-17 year olds. At St Damian's educating students on pertinent issues is at the heart of our vision, which is to provide an 'outstanding' education.

British Science Week



British Science Week was celebrated at St Damian's this month, with a week of activities dedicated to the theme 'connections'. At lunchtime, and as part of Yr7 and Yr8 study clubs pupils applied their knowledge of electrical circuits to communicate via Morse code, led by our amazing Yr10 STEM leaders. Students from all year groups attended a talk by Alex May, a PhD student at the University of

Manchester. His talk, entitled 'Particle Physics and the large Hadron Collider', focused on

machine learning, and its links to the experiments taking place with the Hadron Collider. He compared machine learning with neural networks in the brain, making the talk extremely interesting and relevant for GCSE Biology and Computer Science students. Students built Brookland's gliders and tested their flight. The week concluded with talks from Mr Allsopp on 'the Physics of football' and Dr Robinson on 'soil as part of the Carbon Cycle'.















Student trip to Emmaus Makes the News...









Last month our students visited Emmaus Homeless Charity Community in Mossley, allowing them the opportunity to get a real insight into the Emmaus community and the vital services and support they provide to homeless people. It also raised awareness of our social responsibility and the importance of community volunteering.
