### The Catholic Life of the School

As always, the Catholic life of the school is strong, varied, and purposeful! in the season of Advent, this is no exception.

- Advent Reflections took place in the Chapel for both Staff and students during Advent. Each Friday the Yr10 GIFT team would lead us through reflections, scripture reading and prayers. Resources chosen were from CAFOD and reflected our schools Mission Statement, the 'St Damian's Way'. All events were voluntary and were very well attended, demonstrating our community's commitment to prayer and service. As a thank you, the Yr9 GIFT team provided hot chocolate before the final Advent reflection.
- Our Christmas Carol service returned this year and was as good as ever! Our Yr7 students were spectacular, singing festive Carols along with the grand finale "How Great is Our God", our new school hymn. A wonderful and reverent retelling of the Nativity was performed and beautifully read readings, prayers and poems set the tone for a peaceful and prayerful evening. Thank you for the fantastic parents and community too for supporting this event. I spoke to all parents as they left and the feedback was unanimously positive!
- Our Caritas hampers have been a huge success and we have been overwhelmed with the donations received. A massive thank you to everyone for supporting this very worthy cause that will directly benefit our whole community.

- For all their hard work and commitment to the liturgical life of the school, our outstanding GIFT team enjoyed a special lunch in the hall as a 'Thank-you' from the RE department. They are at the heart of the liturgical life of the school and allow us all to share in the message and life of the Church.
- In RE lessons students have been completing an independent study booklet within their class time and homework tasks to perfect their own independent learning skills. The RE team also conducted a 'Boys Breakfast club' to discuss how boys in Year 11 best learn. From this, staff are producing a revision guide that has been designed around some of the comments made. This will be launched in January in preparation for the run up to the GCSE exams.
- The RE team are currently planning activities for students and staff as part of our annual St Damian's Day on 3rd February 2023. The theme this year is Catholic Social Teaching and the impact this has on our community. One of the events planned will be a 'Diversity Panel'. This will be a discussion on inclusivity and diversity within our St Damian's community. We are looking for volunteers with different 'protected characteristics' to be part of the panel.
- This half term for our 'Local Community Reflection', parishioners from St Ann's and St Christopher's were invited into school, and it was a great success. # Safeguarding

- Assemblies. As we break for Christmas many students plan in their minds 'the perfect Christmas'. This usually includes presents, visiting family, Christmas dinner, decorated houses, snow and meeting friends. However, the reality is that many students feel lonely and isolated at Christmas. To help our students, Mrs Brophy led assemblies based on Anna Freud's Seasonal Self Care Survival Kit, a simple tool based on 6 strategies that children can refer to. If your child appears a little 'fed up' over Christmas talk to them about this survival kit and encourage them to follow some of the ideas. - Senior Mental Health Lead [SMHL]. I am delighted to share with you that Mrs Brophy, our Designated Safeguarding Lead, has now completed the DfE SMHL training. This training, which helps schools understand how to best support students, teachers, parents and the wider school community will be used to help us devise a range of strategies bespoke to St Damian's. We strongly believe that wellbeing and resilience is the key to academic success as well as supporting them personally and socially.

#### Yr10 BTEC Tech Award Construction

Yr10 Construction students carried out their practical assessment worth 30% of their qualification. This required students to apply joinery and carpentry skills to produce a timber frame. They spent time mastering different joining methods and applying their knowledge to produce high quality products. Mrs D'Rozario said they were brilliant and appropriately showcased their practical abilities they have gathered since starting the course and was extremely proud of their hard work and determination. It is clear they have a bright future in the construction industry. Well done!

Mrs Baynham led another successful training session for teachers and LSAs where outstanding classroom practice was shared. Teachers and leaders from Technology, MFL, PE and Geography demonstrated their commitment and high expectations we have for our SEND students so that they thrive in our community and achieve high academic standards. Feedback from SEND students was shared with staff following 'student voice'. From this, it is obvious students value their teachers and the support they receive. For example, one student stated, "St Damian's has helped me to overcome challenges and pushes me to achieve my best". ### Focus on Literacy Update

Literacy Hub. Mrs Heenan and Mrs Toole continue to be pleased with the use of the Literacy Hub since
opening in September. At the time of writing, there have been over 600 book loans from our Hub and our
digital library. Unsurprisingly, the most popular books have been non-fiction books on football stars, such as
Neymar and Ronaldo. Links to our Accelerated Reading programme and our digital library are on the website
under 'library tab'.













- Book Buzz Initiative. This is a reading programme from BookTrust that aims to help students inspire a love
  of reading. Participating students have the opportunity to choose their own books which are all carefully
  selected by a panel of experts to ensure quality, suitability and to encourage reading for pleasure.
- Accelerated Reading. During December, our Yr7 students were delighted to receive their free books. They
  had a fantastic range of books to choose from. For example, 'When the Sky Falls' a book from a child's
  perspective on WW2 and 'You are a Champion' by Marcus Rashford: Marcus shares tips and advice that he
  has learned on his journey to becoming a football star as well as how to handle issues about anxiety.

The ability to read underpins **all** learning of **all** subjects. I quote Margaret Fuller: "**Today a reader, tomorrow a leader**". I encourage parents to ensure that their children are reading and use the great facilities that St Damian's has to offer.

# 'A different kind of gift'?

As part of raising awareness of literacy, members of our Yr9 Literacy class submitted entries to the 'Tameside Libraries Poetry' competition. The task was to write a poem of no more than 200 words on the theme of 'a different kind of gift'. The class generated a range of wonderful ideas and spent time drafting and redrafting their entries. The standard was extremely high within the class. Mrs Butterworth, their class teacher, was very proud that two of our students have been recognised for their thoughtful and creative poems. First prize has been awarded to Jacob Thorley for 'The given gift' and the third prize goes to Elvin Mixhaj for 'The time is a gift too'. A big congratulations to Jacob, Elvin and Mrs Butterworth!

# Yr11 Update

The Mock exams are now complete, and I was pleased with the attitude of the vast majority of our students. Well done Year 11! It is important that the students rest over the break before they start back to a structured revision schedule in January. Congratulations to the Yr11 students who have completed a section of their GCSE Food Preparation and Nutrition practical work where they have to plan, prepare, cook and present 3 dishes to meet a specific need. - ✓ Mr Spencer: Science teacher. Working at St Damian's is both a privilege and a joy. Having taught across a range of schools over the past 9 years I've never felt so welcomed.
