### **Overview**


- The College delivers tailored support to meet the Literacy & Numeracy needs of ALL pupils who did not make Expected Progress at KS2. A total of 33[20%] in English & 30 [16%] in Maths.
- High Level Intervention (6 pupils in English & 3 pupils in Mathematics have a scaled score of 90 and lower).
- The College has been given an allocation of approximately £9,344 for the academic year 2017/18.
