Dear Parents & Carers,

A warm welcome to my last newsletter of the calendar year. And what another highly successful year it has been for our community! As I write, I am reminded and very grateful for the calibre of staff that work here, who all go that 'extra mile' for our great children. In fact, I am both privileged and humbled to lead such great people who include the wonderful support staff, highly professional teachers and competent leaders! A true example of a real authentic catholic school!

## The Catholic Life of the School

As ever, the Advent season provides opportunities for formation, prayer and reflection.

- Weekly reflections have focused on hope and peace. Students have reflected on Global issues through CAFOD's Advent Calendar in form time and Sister Rosaline led a breaktime prayer reflection for staff and pupils. These voluntary events were very well attended, reflecting our community's commitment to prayer and service.
- Our Yr7 GIFT team lead our traditional 'Traveling Nativity', based on the Mexican tradition where it is known as posada. The idea is that a set of simple figures make their way from form room to form room each morning. In Mexico, the Nativity will arrive in the Church on Christmas Eve, at St Damian's the Nativity will arrive at our Staff Advent prayer reflection on Friday Morning.
- The staff Liturgy also focused on Peace and staff reflected on family life and bringing peace into our homes this Christmas. St Damian's staff go above and beyond for our great students, so at Christmas we pray that they rest and dedicate a little extra time to their loved ones over the break.
- Our Caritas Ambassadors have pledged to raise at least £500 to support more vulnerable members of the community this Christmas, taking part in 'Thought for the Day', sharing their hopes for themselves and other people or what small change they will make to #BeeThere for others this Advent.
- The Carol Service 2023 was slightly different this year, with our Choir taking center stage. Mr McArdle and the choir spent many hours practicing and this event showcased our talented students and Mrs Gerschler and her RE team ensured exceptional readings and dance performances that created a feel-good factor for a magical Christmas. Thanks to our fantastic parents for coming out on a cold evening to watch and support our students. I hope that you were proud of our students, your children! On the evening we raised an incredible £248.56 through the raffle and refreshment donations which will go towards the St Damian's Caritas Ambassadors £500 pledge for @CaritasSalford.













- For their commitment to the liturgical life of the school, our outstanding GIFT teams are going receive a 'Gift for the GIFT team'. This is a 'thanks' from the RE department and the whole community. They are at the heart of our liturgical provision that allows us to share in the message and life of the Church.
- In RE lessons students have been completing an independent study booklet to perfect their independent learning skills. The RE team have had great support from Sister Rosaline who has been teaching this half term. Sister has worked in Nigeria as a teacher and is volunteering here to gain experience of teaching in an outstanding school.
- Excitement is growing for the Yr7 retreat to Castlerigg Manor! This week final arrangements will be made including a meeting for students to outline our high expectations.
- The RE team would like to thank Anna Silver, the Education Officer from The Borad of Deputies of British Jews, for providing CPD for the department. This focused on gaining a depth of knowledge in to the 'Why' of the practice or belief in Judaism. Anna shared her depth of knowledge with us and provided Sources of Authority that can be used to increase our RE GCSE outcomes. The staff found her knowledge invaluable and an excellent opportunity for us to ask questions from a member of the Jewish faith tradition.
- Finally, the RE team are currently planning activities for our annual St Damian's Day on 2nd February 2024. The theme this year 'The St Damian's FEAST day'. A Catholic feast day is when we celebrate something or someone important to our faith. The word feast comes from the Latin 'festes', meaning joy and symbolises a time of celebration. We are going to celebrate our whole community and provide opportunities to 'FEAST' on all the great things our community offers! It is going to be a St Damian's FEAST day to remember. The Technology Faculty are exceptionally proud of their mature attitudes and most importantly their determination to succeed! All of this bodes well for their successes next summer. Well done Yr11.

# Staff Professional Development. A Focus on Literacy

At the end of November in our staff Twilight, Mrs Heenan launched our whole school literacy strategy which is called *READ*. This unique and innovative literary strategy will transform the way our students improve their literacy. Ensuring that our students are literate is a strategic objective of St Damian's. In essence, if our students can't read or write then they can't access our knowledge-rich curriculum. READ is an acronym and each letter represents a key strand of what we are trying to achieve. R stands for Reading. We want all our students to read fluently, be able to comprehend and increase their vocabulary skills. E stands for Effective writers as we want students to be able to communicate effectively through the written word. A stands for the ability to Articulate themselves. This, for example, includes the ability to communicate orally during conversations in class and in paired or group discussions. D stands for Developing student's vocabulary. In practice, this means exploring new words and subject specific words to enable pupils to express themselves clearly. Parents can support the READ strategy by encouraging pupils to read more widely at home. SORA, our digital library, has 6000 books freely available for students. At St Damian's, we will continue to foster a love of reading and vocabulary for all of our students.

### **Computer Science**

Our Computer Science provision continues to become embedded at both key stages. The appointment of a new subject lead, increased curriculum time at key stage three and new GCSE course not only matches the ambition within St Damian's for the subject, but also recognises the increasing impact computing has our students and the wider society. Mr Tabas has continued to review and effectively implement many curriculum changes that align with the National Centre for Computing Education guidelines on good practice. Recently, Mr Tabas has formed a partnership with Mrs Murray, Senior Professional Development Leader for STEM learning Ltd to support professional development on teaching Computing Science at St Damian's further. Mrs Murray sent me an email after her visit which was extremely positive, including "It was delightful to wander around and see and hear such a positive learning environment. I didn't really want to leave ". I look forward to our students benefiting from this enhanced provision and participating in interesting and exciting projects in Computing. Watch this space!

# **Punctuality**

Punctuality at St Damian's is two-fold, punctuality to school and secondly, punctuality to lessons.

✓ Punctuality to school: Increasingly more students are late to school. Students arriving after 9am without a valid reason will be issued with a lunchtime detention. Students who are repeatedly late will be issued with further sanctions. I ask that parents impress upon their children the importance of good routines and being punctual. Additionally, please consider allowing enough time for your morning commute: 'Traffic and dropping off siblings' is not considered a valid reason for being late.











✓ Punctuality to lessons: This ensures lessons start positively, shows great attitudes to learning, avoids classroom disruption and minimises wasted time for both students and teachers. Students will be sanctioned by their class teachers for being late to lessons.

May I take this opportunity to say that the majority of children are punctual to both school and class.

### **Tameside Cross Country**



A massive congratulations to the Cross-Country team for their outstanding team and individual performances at the Tameside Cross Country Championships held early December at East Cheshire Harriers Running Track. Our students braved the weather to be part of a successful St Damian's team. Yr7 Girls were crowned Yr7 Tameside Team Champions. The Yr8/9 girls team did exceptionally well, with fantastic individual performances of Thea Brophy in first place and was crowned Tameside champion. The Yr10/11 girls team also did superbly well, finishing as runners up, with four students finishing in the top 20. Mr Burtles said, "An excellent showing by the girls". The boys also contributed to some outstanding results most notably the senior boys Yr10/11 team who finished 4th overall, with Bobby Burton being crowned Tameside Champion again
