Top Tips for Open Days

When attending an open day here are some tips to maximise your experience:

- Attend at least one or two subject talks, sample lectures, taster sessions or department visits.
- Attend finance and application talks where available, find out if there are any bursaries or financial support you could be eligible for
- Make sure to talk to student ambassadors where you can.
- Take a tour of the campus, accommodation, and The Student's Union. This will give you an insight on what life on campus is like.
- Try to find out about the different types of accommodation if you are thinking of moving away. There may be a mix of catered, en-suite or shared bathrooms.

Career Focus - How to become a vet

Entry requirements

You'll usually need:



- GCSEs with high grades including English, Maths and Science
- 3 A levels, or equivalent, including Biology and Chemistry

University

- You'll need to complete a veterinary degree approved by the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS).
- Full-time veterinary degrees usually take 5 years.



- If you already have a degree in a related subject, you may be able to take a 4-year graduate entry veterinary degree course.
- You can also apply to join the <u>Army Medical Service</u> while completing your degree at university. On selection, you would receive further training to become a veterinary officer in the army.

Skills and knowledge

You'll need:

- knowledge of animal medicine and dentistry
- knowledge of biology
- customer service skills
- excellent verbal communication skills
- to be thorough and pay attention to detail
- patience and the ability to remain calm in stressful situations
- · the ability to work well with your hands
- the ability to use your judgement and make decisions
- to be able to use a computer and the main software packages competently

Day-to-day tasks

In general veterinary practice you could:


- diagnose and treat sick and injured animals
- perform operations
- carry out blood analyses, X-rays and scans
- provide care for animals in veterinary hospitals
- carry out regular health checks and give vaccinations
- check farm animals and advise on how to stop diseases spreading
- supervise veterinary nurses and support staff
- keep records of treatments
- communicate with pet owners and insurers
- neuter animals to stop them breeding
- put severely injured or terminally ill animals to sleep
- follow public health and hygiene laws

Overview

On this two-week virtual work experience programme, you'll be introduced to the world of engineering and technology and learn about how Siemens is paving the way towards a more sustainable future.

During this programme, you will meet with Siemens experts to explore the core focusses of the business, such as digitalisation, climate action, smart infrastructure and diversity and inclusion. You'll also be able to discover the variety of roles across the company and learn how to kick-start your career with a Siemens apprenticeship, internship or graduate scheme. You'll also have opportunities to ask questions so you can get a clear picture of what a career at Siemens could look like for you.

The programme will also include some vital employability skills to help you think about entering the world of work and the 'Getting Career Ready' module will encourage you to think about the skills you need for a successful career. The virtual work experience programme involves around 10 hours of activity. You can complete the work over 2 weeks, meaning you can fit it around your schedule (whether that be school or college). The Siemens work experience programme will take place from **25th October - 5th November 2021**. You do not need to be available full time during those dates, but you do need to be able to complete 10 hours worth of activity over the two weeks.

What you'll cover

During this two-week programme you will cover the following areas: - Welcome to Siemens - an overview of the company, its core values and six lines of business. - Engineering - an introduction to the field of engineering, the various disciplines, sustainability in engineering and the design process. - Technology - an introduction to the world of technology, the different pathways within the sector and what roles in tech involve. - Other Business Services - an introduction to the other business services at Siemens: sustainability, legal, marketing and finance - Early Careers at Siemens - an



overview of apprenticeship, internship and graduate schemes at Siemens. - Getting Career ready - an introduction to employability skills, how to build your CV and how to apply for a role at Siemens.
