### **General Update**

### **Pupil Engagement**

Currently, teachers are awarding achievement points to pupils who are actively engaging with lessons and Heads of Year will be rewarding these pupils in a variety of ways. ### **Remote learning: General**

- Live lessons and expectations. I am extremely pleased and proud that all my teachers have embraced remote learning head on. As part of our expectations, all staff are expected to deliver live lessons at least for the beginning of the lesson. Up to now this has worked very well and the many emails from parents are testament to this. However, there may be occasions where teachers will not be able to do this. For example, teachers may have to self-isolate or be absent through sickness. I ask for your understanding if a live lesson does not take place. It will be for a valid reason. It is hoped that if this does occur, it will not be often or for long periods of time.
- Expectations from parents. I would like to take the opportunity to remind parents not to listen in the background. I am sure you will enjoy the lessons, but it is only fair on staff and those in the lessons if they are comfortable that others aren't listening in without them knowing. Please could I also remind parents that you must not contact the teachers via chat. This facility is for the **pupils** only. If you want to contact school, please do so through the normal channels. Furthermore, can I remind parents that only pupils are to access the lessons on TEAMS. This week a pupils account was used by a family member to interrupt a lesson and make immature comments. I will not tolerate this. If this does occur I will contact parents and ban the child from joining live lessons.

At this point, I must again congratulate the vast majority of our pupils who are, under difficult circumstances, logging in day after day and participating in their lessons. It makes me so proud.

## Safeguarding: Children's Mental Health Week 1<sup>st</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup> February

Looking after the welfare of our great pupils is a key aspect of the St Damian's experience. In fact, as a community we aim to provide exceptional pastoral care as we believe that 'happy' children achieve. Next week is designated '*Children's Mental Health Week*'. # **Careers Update**

'Connect2CollegeLive' is a series of live sessions being hosted by the Manchester College for schools. On Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> February [11:00 – 11:30], 'An introduction to T Levels' will be broadcast for Yr9 -11 pupils which includes essential information on new post 16 qualifications and on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> February [11:00 – 11:30], there is a session for Year 9 on 'Choosing your Options'. I ask that parents of pupils in Yr9 - 11 read the separate letter on the website and ensure that your child attends these sessions. There will be small changes to the timings of the school day to accommodate these live sessions.

Please look at the latest Careers bulletin in the 'Careers Update' tab on the website. This edition includes the latest information from colleges, a STEM competition for Yr7 - 9 pupils, STEM & Medical Sciences work experience & summer schools as well as apprenticeships information from providers such as the Utilities Industry, Highways England & British Telecom.

At St Damian's our careers guidance is extensive. Pupils who embrace all the various activities are more likely to understand the options post-16.
