**Updates from Colleges, Sixth Forms & the Careers Service**

I have had correspondence from some of our post 16 providers. They are keen to reassure you that they will do all they can to ensure a smooth transition into post-16 education. I am pleased to be able to share the information I currently have.

**Ashton Sixth Form**

The college's Guidance and Enrichment Manager has developed an e-enrichment programme for their students which we are able to share with Y11 Leavers and it is hoped that they will take part.
