



KEY messages for Year 10 PUPILS: School re-opening June 22nd

[A] Social distancing

- You must always ensure a physical distance of 2 metres
- Ask other people politely to move away if you feel that they are too close
- It is a serious offence to purposely break the 2m social distancing rule
- When travelling to and from school you will be expected to follow social distancing rules

[B] When you come into school

- You will be in full uniform
- You will be allocated a group number (1, 2 or 3) and room this will be your 'group' for all sessions you attend
- You will queue outside with your group on arrival to school
- You will be directed by a member of staff when to enter the school building
- You must go directly to your room and sit in your allocated seat
- You will not mix with pupils from other groups

[C] Access around the school

- When in school you will be told which areas are not accessible
- You must only move around the school when you have been given permission by a member of staff
- You must follow the one-way system and signage around school
- All groups will be allocated a bathroom which will only be used by that specific group

[D] In the classroom

- You will have your own desk and chair for the full day. You must not change places
- You must store your coat and bag by your chair
- Go straight to your seat on entry to the classroom
- Do not touch other surfaces in the classroom unnecessarily
- You should bring your own basic equipment, for example your calculator and do not share with others
- There will be sanitisers, tissues in school to be used throughout the day
- Put your hand up to ask permission if you need to leave your seat

[E] Hygiene

- Sanitise your hands as you enter school
- Wash your hands at break and lunch before and after you eat
- Wash or sanitise your hands regularly throughout the day
- Make sure that hands are washed with soap for at least 20 seconds after using the toilet
- Avoid touching your face
- Follow the government guidelines of 'Catch-it, bin-it, kill-it' when sneezing and coughing



[F] General behaviour

- As always, high expectations are expected
- As usual you will be expected to follow our five simple rules
- Respect other pupils and their feelings
- If you are concerned about someone's behaviour, report it to a member of staff

[G] Covid-19 related behaviour

- You must not cough, sneeze or spit deliberately
- You must not deliberately scaremonger
- You must not touch other people
- You must respect the wellbeing of our community
- There is a zero tolerance with regards to this
- Sanctions will be put in place if you break these rules
- Any concerns, speak to a member of staff

[H] Learning expectations & Remote learning

- Your time in school will be very different from what it was previously
- Expect some face to face contact where you will be signposted to help resolve possible issues
- Remote Learning and working independently is the main way of learning for all courses and is essential
- Lessons in school will support the **more effective use** of Remote Learning
- You need to be well prepared for your exams next year
- If you are concerned about a lesson/topic then contact your teacher via the chat facility on Teams
- If you feel you are unable to raise an issue with your classroom teacher then share your concern with the teacher who is contacting you fortnightly (FT, HOY, SSO)
- Continue to read at home. Don't underestimate the value of reading; it improves your vocabulary, spelling, helps your essay writing & comprehension skills as well as broadening your understanding of the world
- Use the Microsoft Teams 'literacy group' to access reading suggestions and guidance
- Working in school and at home is the key to future success
