It has been another eventful week at St Damian's but at last we have got the news that we have been waiting for. On Monday it was announced that pupils are to return to school from 8th March. The return of pupils is likely to be phased so that we can administer the testing required. I will be sending out a letter on Tuesday 2nd March around midday that outlines the details for this return. This letter will need to be read very carefully. However, in the interim, it is important that pupils continue to engage in the remote learning until they return. My staff and I are delighted that pupils will be returning very soon and we will be planning carefully behind the scenes for a successful re-integration

We are now in the period of Lent, a time for reflection. School Return

We now know that pupils will return from 8th March. This is great news for your children and the wider St Damian's community. Face to face learning in a safe positive environment is what your child deserves. In the letter on Tuesday, I will outline a few reminders to ensure that this return to school is safe for all. However, may I remind parents that Covid has seriously affected some members of staff. As Headteacher, I will not compromise on the safety of my staff at any time. ALL pupils are expected to follow these simple but fair rules.

Rapid Lateral Flow Testing Consent

This continues to take place, with the sole aim to safeguard ALL in our community. This is NOT a medical procedure. We have been conducting these tests since the beginning of January and there have been NO issues at all. There is no real reason why all pupils can't undergo this test. To ensure a smooth running of the testing process when students return to school, I ask that you complete your child's consent before returning to school w/c 8th March 2021. There are two simple steps to this process;

- Step 1: You will receive a TEXT message from 07507332277 which directs you to an online consent form. Please save this number in your phone for future notifications from us.
- Step 2: Once you have completed the form online you MUST respond to the TEXT message with either 'YES' or 'NO' to activate your preference.

It is as simple as that!

Building Pupil Confidence...

One of our major objectives for the return to school is to re-engage all our pupils. We will do so in a measured and proportionate approach. But it will not involve massive intervention or catch-up, that simply puts added pressures and anxieties on both pupils and staff. What it will involve is re-establishing the positive relationships based on respect that St Damian's is renowned for, and delivering high quality teaching.

Furthermore, we aim to build confidence and promote leadership opportunities in our pupils by the following;

- Year 10 prefects. During remote learning, year 10 pupils have been asked to draft their letter of
 application to become a prefect. It is an honour to be a prefect at St Damian's and they are
 outstanding ambassadors for the St Damian's community.
- Pupil Learning Forum [PLF]. As part of their remit to improve pupils' learning experiences, our year 9 PLF will be asking KS3 pupils 'What do they think helps them to engage with their learning?'. They will then share their findings with teachers and pupils to support with their re-engagement.
- Form Captains. Forms in Years 7 10 will be re-electing their Form/Vice Captains. A massive 95% of pupils who experienced this leadership opportunity last term said they had enjoyed this role and 89% felt they had developed confidence and resilience as a result of taking on the role of a pupil leader. This is a great opportunity to develop skills for the future.

National Careers Week

The National Careers Week will take place 1st - 5th March 2021. As you would expect St Damian's is planning a comprehensive programme of activities during this week. This year, activities will take place via virtual events on Teams. Pupils will be given an update on Labour Market Information with a particular focus on changes to the job market as a result of Covid. Yr.9 and Yr.10 pupils are asked to get involved in a form competition to develop entrepreneurship and project management skills where they can contribute to ideas on how to 'Build Back Better'. Pupils will also learn about career opportunities across the curriculum. The final programme for pupils will be published on Teams.

Year 11 and Exams Consultation

The details on this years' 'GCSE examinations', at the time of writing, have not been published. However, I am expecting it imminently. I am hoping that I will be able to share any details with parents as soon as possible. Rest assured that as soon as we receive the information, leaders will be working hard behind the scenes to ensure that your child gets the grades they deserve.

I know that I keep reiterating this, but it is absolutely crucial that your child in continues to work hard over the next few months. Yes, there is another week of remote learning but attendance at all live lessons, engaging fully and persevering is important. This continued effort will have an impact on the final grades they are awarded.

More Great News Regarding Oxbridge

A few weeks ago I announced that our ex Headboy, Oliver Cooney, was given an offer to study Linguistics at St John's College, Cambridge. I am now delighted to report that Katrina Nabukenya, a Year 10 pupil, has been accepted on the Year 10 Course Target Oxbridge course with Trinity College, Cambridge. This is a real personal achievement for her and again demonstrates that St Damian's mantra, 'Believe to Achieve' is alive and well. We wish Katrina the best of luck in this venture.

Year 9 Options Process

At St Damian's, our Options programme started in earnest on Wednesday with the launch of the Year 9 options through a Teams assembly. The options process will continue over the next few weeks and pupils must attend the Options programme being delivered each Wednesday at 9am in assembly time. Subject Leaders will present options choices and the Options Presentation for parents will be released on Monday 8th March. Lessons over the next couple of weeks will include guidance on how to revise effectively. It is important that Yr.7 pupils get into good study routines and complete the work required so that they are well prepared for the assessments.
