

In our third Alumni Newsletter, Mrs Taylor shares her journey from St. Damian's pupil to Teacher of History & Faculty Leader, PSHE

I joined St Damian's in September 2001. I had transferred primary schools late in Year 6 which was extremely daunting, but it had also prepared me well for new friends making and embracing my next transition, starting "big" school. memories Damian's were feeling instantly welcomed and I knew straight way that I was going to be happy here. I made some great friends, and I am still close to them today.

I enjoyed most subjects in school apart from Maths which still gives me the shivers to this day. I always loved History and RE and had decided from a young age that I wanted to be a teacher. I will be honest; I have never found any of my studies easy and have had to work extremely hard to gain qualifications that I have today. I have been brought up on the mantra that you have to work hard for anything in life and as a result knowing that you will appreciate everything you have when you know you have put everything into it.

Throughout my time as a St Damian's student. always offered lots of extracurricular activities and during my time I took part in cross country, the school council, and a talent show. I also enjoyed two ski trips, including one visit to New York which is an experience my friends and I still discuss. I look back on my time so fondly, we had lots of laughs, were taught by some great teachers, and made some fantastic memories.

remember being devastated when eventually left in 2006 and missed a lot of the people I had seen every day for the past 5 years. At 16, you think your school friends are your whole world and don't think you will make any new friends as you get older. Many of my friends went to Loreto Xaverian Colleges but I chose to go to Ashton Sixth Form as it was just so close to home. I was lucky in that I knew what I wanted to do for my career and what steps needed to take in order to achieve it. studied A Levels in Sociology, History and

Religious Studies. The jump from GCSE to A-Level was extremely challenging, but I enjoyed the subjects I studied and loved that I could now narrow my focus and go into more detail with the subjects I enjoyed.

Following on from my Alevels, I went to Manchester University to study History and Sociology. I decided to move away from home and live in halls of residence. This was such an invaluable experience, and I had a great time gaining some independence and meeting new people. Throughout my 3 years, I lived in Hulme and Fallowfield and loved the buzz of living in the city but also knowing I wasn't too far away from home. During my studies I also had a part time job at Marks and Spencer, and I think it provided me with some invaluable life skills, it certainly helped me my confidence when it came to interviews for my teacher training place.

graduated from Manchester University in 2011 and applied to do my PGCE straight away. I felt quite determined wanted to get into work as soon as possible. I had considered having a year out to travel and work but I was concerned that I might struggle then to get back into studying again. I loved learning but I also had a clear vision of what I wanted to do and where I wanted to be by a certain age. I completed my PGCE at Edge Hill University and made some great friends there.

The year was extremely difficult, but I knew it would be worth it and I had to stick at it. I stayed at home during this time and was glad that I had passed my driving test whilst studying at university as my school placements were in Rawtenstall and Bolton. I applied for my first job at teaching Joseph's in Horwich and enjoyed my first few years teaching Travelling to Bolton every day was tough, but the school was very similar to Damian's and received a lot of support and training from an outstanding history department.

When a job came up at St Damian's, I couldn't miss out on the opportunity as I knew I wanted to come back eventually. I have worked here for 7 years now, and I love the place. I know a lot of people who have opted out of teaching, so I know how lucky I am to work in such a supportive department and school. The pupils here are wonderful and every day is different. Teaching is extremely challenging but also such a rewarding job. I am confident that it is a career I will be sticking with for the rest of my working life.
